Printmaking and following in the footsteps of giants, physically engaging with the technique, process and materials is an engaging and evocative activity. Using photographic images, digitally manipulated, further re-visualised in true grain, combined with other printmaking techniques, enable me to create large screen prints, etchings and collage.

I have childhood memories of colouring books and felt pens, paper, pencil and paints drawing and painting favourite characters. Hours spent imagining far off lands, fairytale and mythical realms, full of intrigue and curiosity. Knitting, sewing and craft making have also woven and threaded themselves through various periods of my life, so to formalise all this making and creating, I have the amazing opportunity, as a mature student, to study BA Fine Art at Falmouth University and am now in my final year.

I am also currentyly in a unique position of being 'Artist in Residence' at Goonhilly Earth Station, The Lizard, Cornwall, where my large site specific prints are on permanent display by invitation of the owners, GES Ltd.
